

Stories of our Nature Center Building with Richard Stuenkel Sunday, June 12 1-4 p.m. Free All ages

Special guest speaker Richard Stuenkel will share his knowledge and recollections of the Thorn Creek Nature Center when it was the Immanuel Evangelical Lutheran Church, and stories of the local communities and woodland as they were when he was growing up in the area. Those attending are invited to come with questions.

Then join our naturalist on a hike in the woods.

Mr. Stuenkel still farms on the land originally owned by his grandfather, and lives in the 130 year-old

farmhouse in Monee. Stuenkel Road which runs past Governors State University is named for the train stop Stuenkel's Crossing, run by one of Richard's family members. After World War II, he worked for a company that supplied heavy equipment used to build Park Forest.

Thorn Creek Trail and Building News



A top priority has been to stabilize and complete the new North Bridge. The Thorn Creek Management Commission just approved a contract to bring rip rap to stabilize the North Bridge piers protecting them from further erosion. The

project will be done this spring and Friends Capital Fund is funding it for \$3000.

Our N-S boardwalk — the very long north-south boardwalk on our Woodland Trail — was built over a number of years starting in 1980. In the last few years our volunteer Mark Petnuch has singlehandedly worked to keep the N-S boardwalk in good repair. He replaces planks and stabilizes the boardwalk supports. It requires continuous maintenance and we are very fortunate to have Mark.

Friends of Thorn Creek Woods Board members Sue Zelek, Carolyn Gann and Alice Hanes are spearheading a **South Bridge Committee** to look at designs for replacing the demolished south bridge. Contact the nature center for information on their next meeting. There is some funding (in the Friends Capital Fund) for a possible south bridge but our current design estimates are in the \$25,000-\$40,000 range.

Trail Watchers are our eyes & ears on Thorn Creek trails reporting trail problems and nature observations. Use the blue Trail Watchers forms available at the trail kiosk. You can fill out the form and leave in the Drop Box at front door of nature center. You can also follow up by leaving a message on nature center phone 708-747-6320 or e-mailing the nature center at thorn_creek@att.net. Your input and observations are welcome and important. They help us get trail problems solved quickly—like removing downed trees.

We're identifying a number of wet spots on our the Nature Center Loop and the Woodland Trail where **new boardwalks** need to be installed—great projects for the Trail Workdays or Eagle Scout projects.

Our **Owl Lake Trail** especially the portion looping around Owl Lake itself needs a lot of work including at least one boardwalk. And the small bridge between the pine tunnel and Owl Lake needs to be stabilized.

Get down and dirty and help Master Gardeners from the University of Illinois Extension Service care for Thorn Creek's Prairie Sampler. Located in front of the Nature Center, the small prairie that was nurtured by the late Jim Marzuki needs your help with weeding, pulling tall goldenrod, trimming out woody plants, and identifying native species present.

For all Thorn Creek Workdays:

Bring your own gloves, hand clippers, and kneelers if you like. Dress for the weather and wear sturdy shoes or boots. Bring a lunch and refreshments will be provided. Outdoor work is on natural surface across uneven terrain.

We need to find a contractor to do the repair work, and estimates for painting the exterior. We'll need additional funding from the Village to add to the Friends Capital Fund to be able to accomplish all these repairs.



Nature Programs for Groups at Thorn Creek Nature Center Are Sponsored By Thorn Creek Audubon Society

Calling all schools, home school groups, day cares, preschools, youth, adult and family groups! Nature Education Programs are offered at Thorn Creek Nature Center throughout the year where your group can discover the plants and animals of Thorn Creek Woods.

These Nature Education Programs are sponsored by the Thorn Creek Audubon Society. The Audubon Society and the Thorn Creek Nature Center announce their new Partnership for Programming to further the Society's environmental education mission and give valuable assistance to Thorn Creek Nature Center in providing nature programming for groups of area children and adults.

Some of the nature education programs offered this year include *Birding by*Sight and Sound, Creek Walk (the world of aquatic insects and metamorphosis), Trees Big and Small (identification by leaves and bark), Insects (what makes an insect unique), the Web of Life (interdependence of producers, consumers, predators and decomposers), Soils Hike (how soil fuels and supports life), and Night Hikes.

On the Fall Color Hike learn why leaves change colors and what trees do to prepare for the long months of winter. Discover clues to wild animals' identities and behavior by trails and trails in Wild Animal Tracks. Make your own track replica. On Vixen's Trek you are the fox following your daily routines on Thorn Creek trails. Or visit the Historic Farm in the woods to explore an early 1900's woodland farm.

Groups can also arrange for a naturalist to come to your location for programs such as Wild Animal Tracks, Web of Life, Woodland Wildflowers, Soils, History of Thorn Creek Woods, and the like.

"Part of our mission is to provide environmental education," said TCAS President Al Thomas. "The Thorn Creek Nature Center has a building, two excellent trained naturalists, and of course the 850-plus acre Thorn Creek Woods. We don't have either a building or naturalists. I think one of the best ways we can fulfill our own education mission is to help the Nature Center provide even more programs."

"We are thrilled to expand our relationship with the Thorn Creek Audubon Society in this new direction," said Judy Mendelson, Chair of Thorn Creek Woods Management Commission. "This is enhancing the long-standing support and interest we have received from Thorn Creek Audubon since the 1960s."

The new partnership has already collaborated in sponsoring three programs: the *Learn 70 Birds by Spring* class, which runs from January through March; the *Great Backyard Bird Count Open House* that was held in February; and the *Build a Gourd Birdhouse* sessions to be held in March.

TCAS members will assist with the programs and the Society's education committee, Karen Blackful and Michelle O'Connor, will meet regularly with Nature Center personnel. "By combining our expertise and our resources we can provide more and better programs for both young people and adults," said O'Connor.

TCAS has just approved a generous donation of \$750 for these programs including purchase of animal tracks molds, insect collectors, books for the Learn 70 Birds program and staff costs for two Nature Education programs.

Minimum group size for all Nature Education programs is ten with a maximum of 20. Larger groups may be accommodated based on staff availability. Registration is required and all programs require a minimum of four weeks notice. When you call to register be sure to have three dates in mind in case your first choice isn't available

The cost for a group of 1-10 is \$25, group of 11-20 is \$50, and group of 21-30 is \$75. Additional fees for materials may apply for some programs.

Programs are typically 1 to 1.5 hours in length, including trail hikes. Nature Center tours are available but will require additional time.

These Nature Education Programs plan for groups to experience Thorn Creek Nature Preserve firsthand. Participants should dress for outdoor weather and natural terrain trails.
